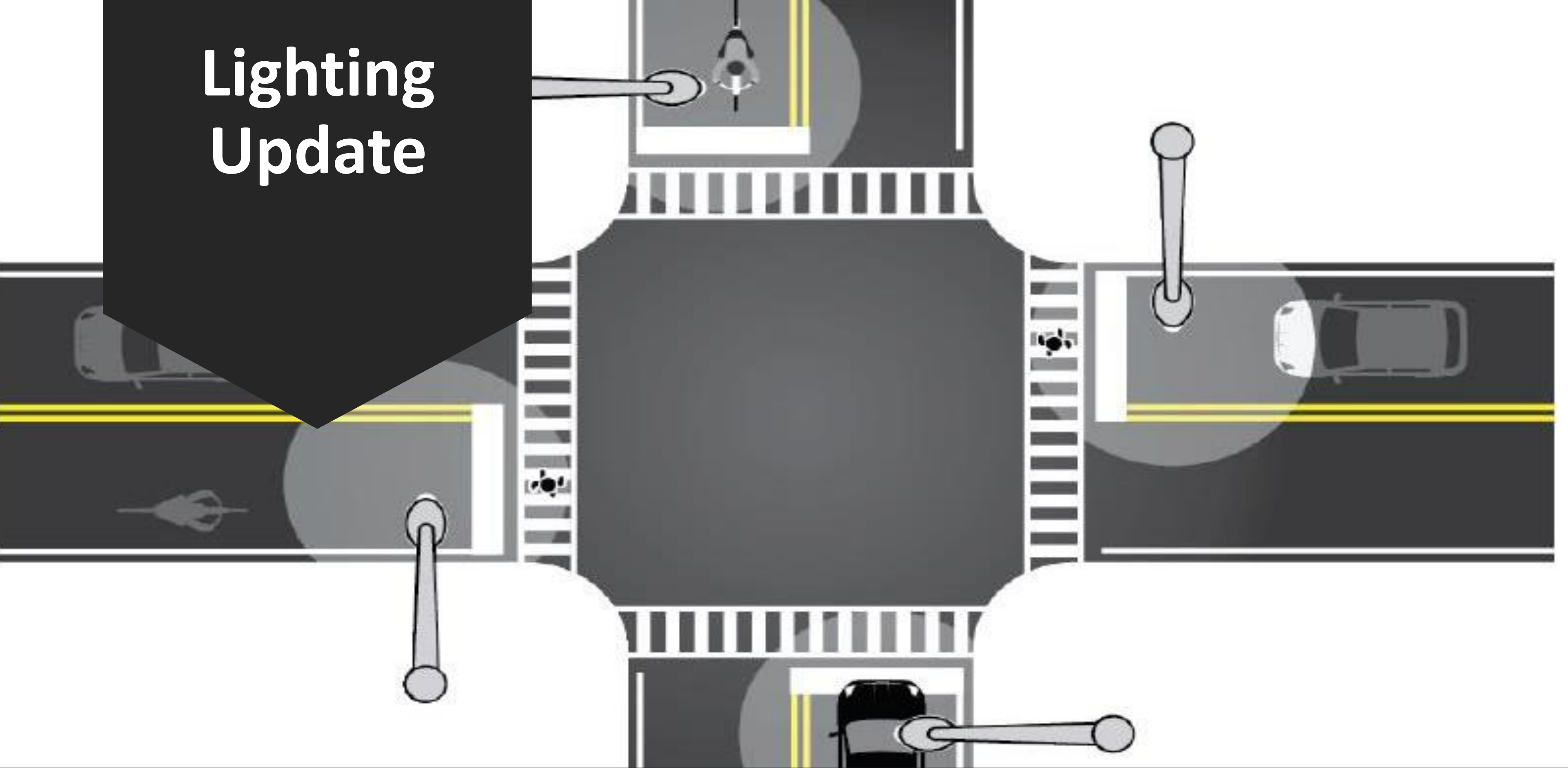
- Recognition of Kemberli Sargent, Vision Zero Manager, passed on 7/14/2022.
- Importance of Department's mission and Vision Zero program.
- Vision Zero Action Plan effort is kicking off before the end of Summer 2022 with Toole Design Group as lead consultant, includes:
 - *Extensive public engagement including establishment of the Vision Zero Task Force*
 - *Refinement/update of existing High Injury Network and further crash analysis*
 - *Action Plan with multi-year strategies and actions, including specific interventions and countermeasures for top high crash corridors and intersections*
 - *Setting of target year to reach zero*

ATLDOT Update *(con't)*



- ATLDOT is pursuing numerous federal funding solicitations under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) including:
 - *Mega – Campbellton Road High Capacity Transit*
 - *Safe Streets 4 All – Pryor and Central Multimodal corridor project*
 - *Bridge Formula Program – Marietta Road Bridge and Marietta Blvd Bridge projects under consideration*
 - *Reconnecting Communities Pilot – Lee Street Multimodal corridor project*

✓ **Phase 0** GPC Lighting Services Audit to Support Phase 1

- Full Audit of COA's existing lighting system completed by GPC in Fall 2021
- Audit revealed that ~25% of the COA's lights were inoperable

Phase 1 GPC Acquisition and Upgrade of ~9,300 COA Lights



~75%+ of All Lights

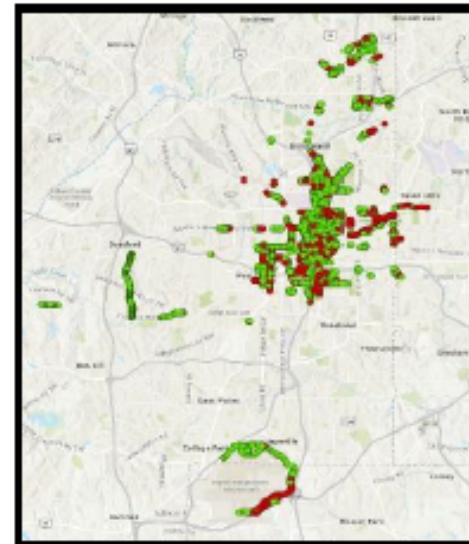

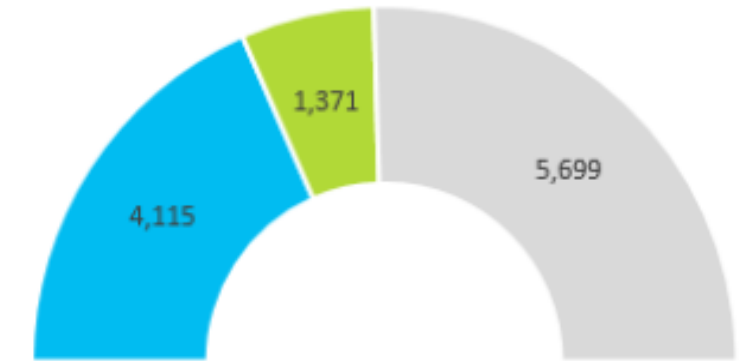

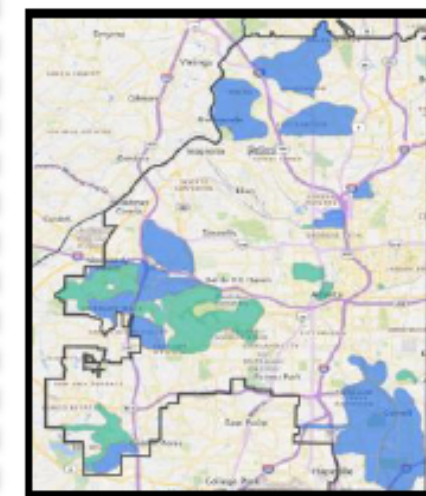

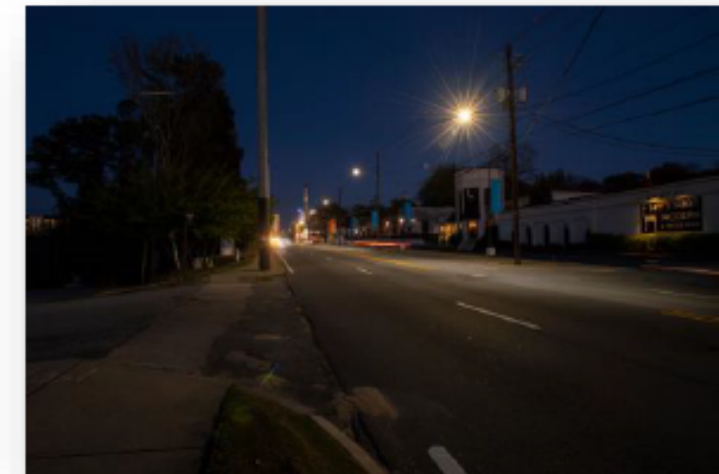

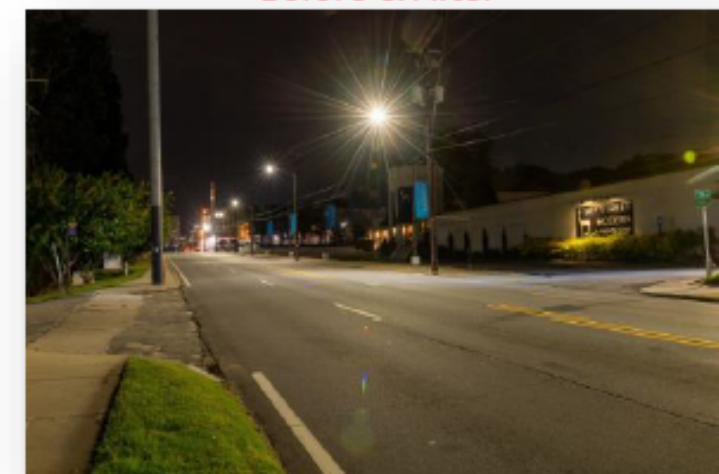

YTD Totals

- Potholes – 4,219 (*see metrics*)
- Sidewalk repairs – 6,000LF

Goals & Looking Ahead for FY23

- Continue focusing on proactive pothole repairs
- Repair 6,000LF of sidewalk
- Install more speed tables with internal crews
- Continue implementing safety enhancements developed by DOT Street Intervention Team
- Prep for snow and ice season

Strategy & Planning Update

- Atlanta City Council and Atlanta voters approved of \$750M in infrastructure investment.
- ATLDOT Strategy & Planning developed the plan for \$460M in transportation investments
- ATLDOT, created by Mayor Dickens, is the first dept to ever propose finishing sidewalks on major streets on Southside.
- The Administration needs to deliver a strategic delivery plan for Moving Atlanta Forward by Sept 30th.
- ← ATLDOT Strategy applied for \$180M in federal funding on May 23, 2022, and produced the grant app 100% in house -
“The City of Atlanta and Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA) are requesting \$180M in MEGA funding to accelerate the \$315M project.”
- The City of Atlanta & MARTA may have close to \$3B in relevant infrastructure funding by 2030.
 - ATLDOT Federal Funding Priorities
 - Safe Streets, Sidewalks & Trails
 - Transit Expansion
 - Bridges (Includes reconnecting communities across highways)



ATLDOT Strategy & Planning – at the mayor’s office direction – has an aggressive plan for federal funding this year

- **MEGA/INFRA** (Submitted)
\$180M request for Campbellton BRT with More MARTA Match
- **Safe Streets for All** (In-Progress)
Administration prioritized Central/Pryor Protected bike lanes to connect Downtown Atlanta to the Southside Beltline. We’d like to brand this project “The SouthLine”
- **Bridges** (In-Progress)
We aspire to federalize the replacement of Marietta Road Bridge the city’s major bridge with the lowest rating
- **Reconnecting Communities** (To-be launched)
Need to finalize choice with the mayor’s office

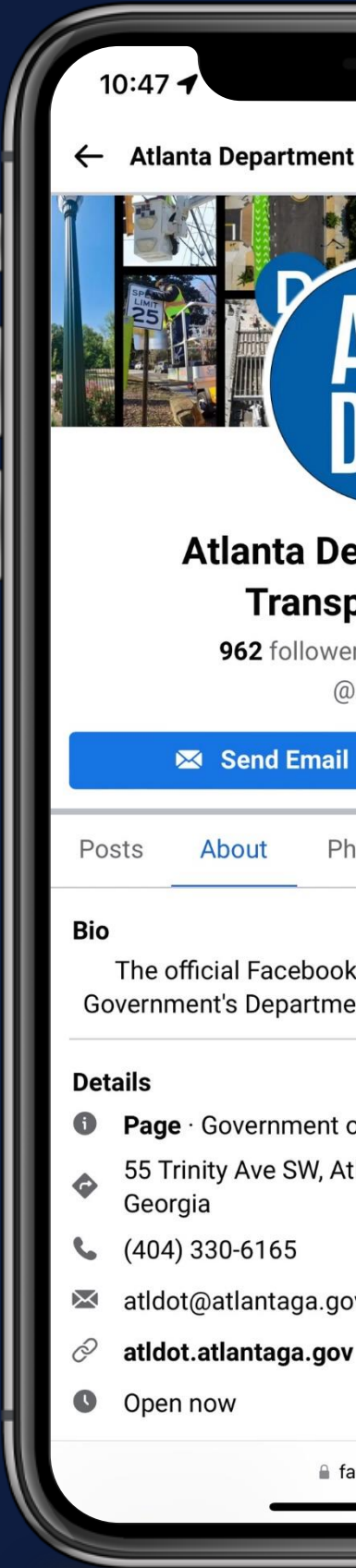
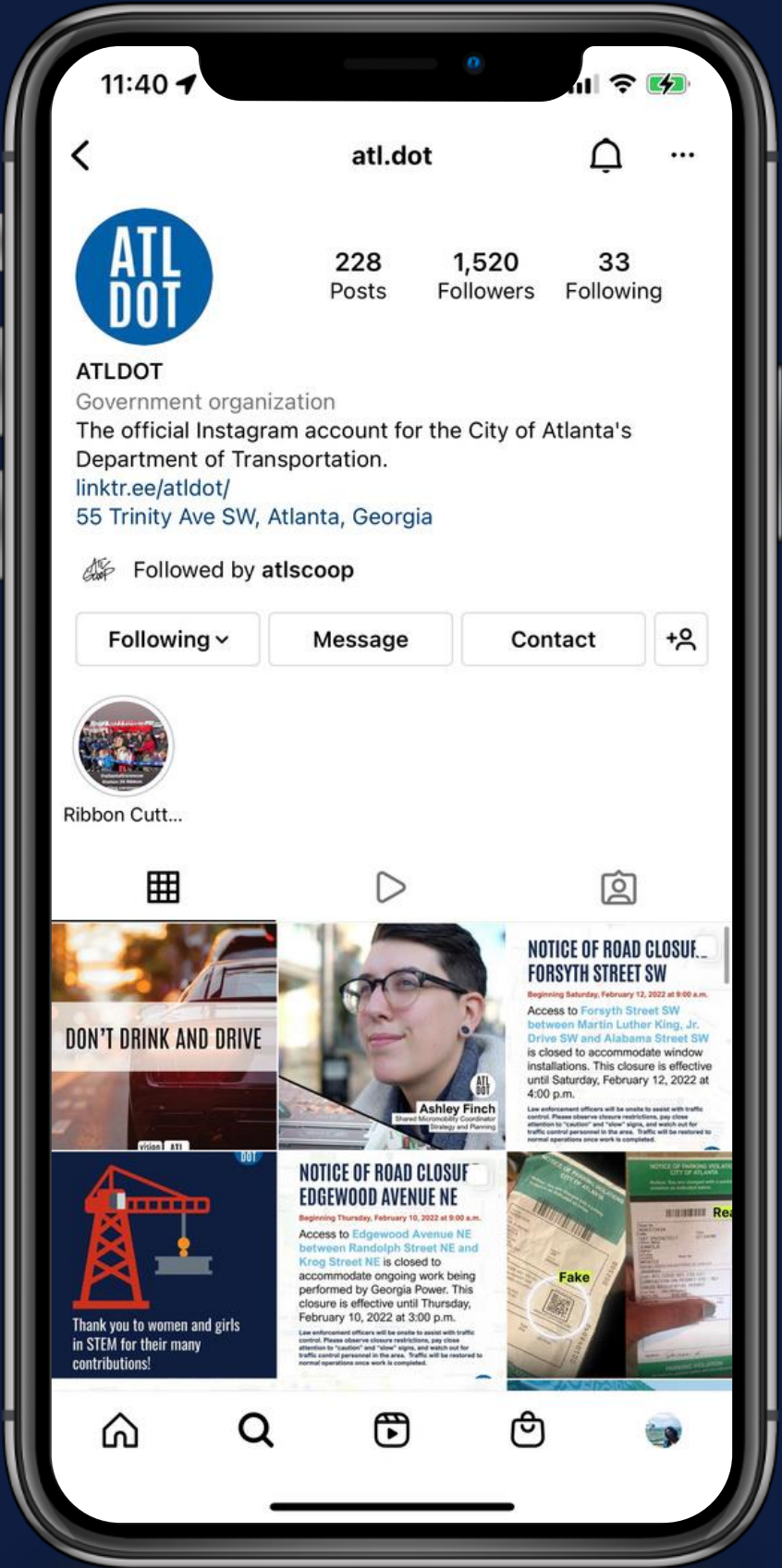
